

A Psalm of Thanksgiving

"A psalm of thanksgiving is an invitation to enter God's presence with worship by giving thanks for who He is and what He has done.

Some Psalms of thanksgiving you can refer too are
Psalm 34, 67, 92, 95, 100, 111, 113, 149, 150.

Begin your psalm with a call/invitation to give God thanksgiving.
You are announcing your intention to give thanks to God.

Oh Come Let Us...

- Give thanks to the Lord
- Sing to the Lord
- Make a joyful noise to our God
- Rejoice in what our God has done
- Lift high the name of Jesus
- Boast in the Lord
- Shout onto the Lord
- Taste and see the Lord is good
- Exalt thee
- Extol the Father
- Proclaim the goodness of God
- Celebrate the one true God

How

- Worship
- Bow down
- Kneel
- Use of instruments
- Humble
- Sacrifice

The invitation to praise is followed by statements declaring who God is and what He has done. (Refer to slide for prompts)

The closing of the Psalm follows the same structure as the beginning. It reaffirms the call to worship with thanksgiving. Refer to prompt one.
